Introduction

- * Tin mining in Bangka Belitung, has been operated since the 17th century.
- * Once was monopolized and deminished in 1999 following the change of administration and regional autonomy in 2004.
 - * Has increased income and an economic driver for years, while leaving environmental and social issues.
- * Onshore rehabilitation is much developed, but who has more important role in the success of rehabilitation?



Method & Result



- * Based on literature studies and observations.
- * From studies and pilot projects, onshore revegetation considered successful.
- * Studies to find potential economic plant species.
- * Re-mining by illegal miners, and the low law enforcement made moratorium in 2001-2005.
- * Freedom for mining was falsely interpreted and sometimes become political commodity.

Conclusions

- * Agricultural technique has being developed and onshore revegetation considered successful.
- * Unless strong commitment by stakeholders, revegetation will fail, and people would harvest the loss.
